





Job 38:1-11

¹Then the LORD answered Job out of the whirlwind and said: ²"Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge? ³Dress for action like a man; I will question you, and you make it known to me. ⁴"Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding. ⁵Who determined its measurements—surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it? ⁵On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone, ⁵when the morning stars sang together and all the sons of God shouted for joy? ⁵"Or who shut in the sea with doors when it burst out from the womb, ⁵when I made clouds its garment and thick darkness its swaddling band, ¹oand prescribed limits for it and set bars and doors, ¹¹and said, 'Thus far shall you come, and no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stayed'?

2 Corinthians 6:1-13

We are treated as impostors, and yet are true: 9as unknown, and vet well known; as dving, and behold, we live: as punished, and yet not killed; 10 as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, yet possessing everything. 11We have spoken freely to you, Corinthians; our heart is wide open. ¹²You are not restricted by us, but you are restricted in your own affections. ¹³In return (I speak as to children) widen your hearts also.

Mark 4:35-41

³⁵On that day, when evening had come, [Jesus] said to them, "Let us go across to the other side." ³⁶And leaving the crowd, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. And other boats were with him. ³⁷And a great windstorm arose, and the waves were breaking into the boat, so that the boat was already filling. ³⁸But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion. And they woke him and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" ³⁹And he awoke and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm. ⁴⁰He said to them, "Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?" ⁴¹And they were filled with great fear and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even wind and sea obey him?"

Notes on Today's Service

Treasures from the Church: "Rest is in Him alone. Man knows no peace in the world, but he has no disturbance when he is with God." - St Bernard of Clairvaux

Summary of the Readings: In his anguish and affliction, Job must be reminded that, as a finite creature, he is in no position to question the Maker of the heavens and the earth. Job's "words without knowledge" are unable to penetrate the wisdom of the Lord (Job 38:1–2). For the Lord has "prescribed limits" and "set bars and doors," so that "here shall your proud waves be stayed" (Job 38:9–11). That's how He humbles us unto repentance. But also by His powerful Word, He calms the "great windstorm" and the waves "breaking into the boat." He does not permit the chaos of this fallen world to overwhelm us or bring us to despair. By the Word of His Gospel, He speaks "Peace!" to us, which bestows the "great calm" of His new creation (Mark 4:37–39). Therefore, do not be afraid, and do not receive this grace of God in vain. "Now is the favorable time," and "now is the day of salvation" (2 Cor. 6:1–2).

The Hymn: "Be Still, My Soul": "The key to this hymn is Psalm 46:10: 'Be still, and know that I am God. I will be exalted among the nations: I will be exalted in the earth!' Twice during each stanza, the Christian sings, 'Be still, my soul.' The question is, why should one's soul be still? The answer: because the Lord is on the Christian's side (stanza 1) ... Thus, though the way is thorny, Christ, the best and truest Friend, leads the Christian past such crosses and pain into the eternal joys of heaven. Stanza 2 has a simple teaching: as God has worked in the past for the sake of those who believe in Him, He will continue to do so in the days to come...When the time is right, God will reveal what He has taught; namely, that all things (even evil things done to the believer) work for the good of those who love Him (Romans 8:28)...Stanza 3 asks that the Christian might have a blessed end. to be taken from this 'vale of tears' to live with God in heaven. Whatever losses the Christian suffers for the confession of Christ (including loss of friends, family, and reputation) will be superabundantly restored, if not now, then in eternity...Stanza 4 reminds the Christian that though life in this world seems to go slowly, the hour of death and the soul's ascent to be with God are nonetheless hastening on. That blest heaven will have no more cares, sorrows, or crosses of any type: those who have come out of the great tribulation of earthly life will be clothed in robes washed white in the blood of the Lamb; and they will no longer hunger, thirst, or cry, but will dwell with the Lamb who saved them (Revelation 7:14-17). When Christ comes again in triumph, then all Christians, with perfected bodies and souls, will live before Him in a joyful place of endless days." - Lutheran Service Book: Companion to the Hymns, Volume 1, pp.1086-1087.

Sermon: Are you having trouble sleeping? Some common causes of insomnia include stress, concerns about work, school, health, finances or family. All these things can keep your mind active at night, making it difficult to sleep. In addition, stressful life events or trauma such as the death or illness of a loved one, divorce, or a job loss also may lead to sleepless nights. In our text for today, the disciples are anxious and stressed out about a storm while Jesus is sleeping on a cushion in the stern of the boat without a care in the world. The disciples, after waking Him up, accuse Him of not caring that they are perishing. In response, Jesus stills the storm with a word, and they go from worrying about the storm to being terrified of Him. "And they were filled with great fear and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?" Jesus is Lord, God Himself in the flesh, Emmanuel, God with us, and He is the Christ, who has come to use His power and authority not to harm us, but to save us.
