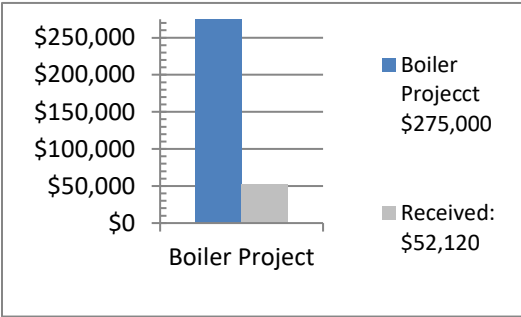

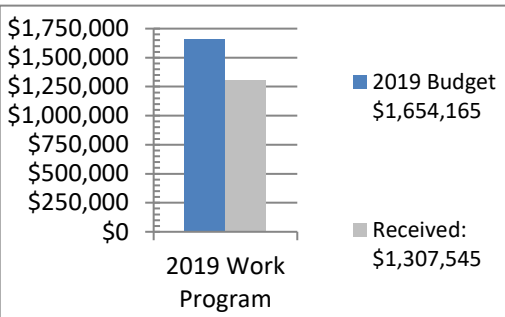

Learn By Heart: The Third Article LSB #323

Readings for next Sunday: Mal. 3:13-18, Col. 1:13-20, Luke 23:27-43

Today in Sunday School: Today in Sunday School we studied the account “David Becomes King.” Just as David reigned over Israel, so the God-man, Jesus, our David, reigns over the kingdom of grace, of which we are citizens. Consider asking, *“How was King David different from King Saul? How does Jesus serve as our King?”*

Malachi 4:1-6 ¹⁴For behold, the day is coming, burning like an oven, when all the arrogant and all evildoers will be stubble. The day that is coming shall set them ablaze, says the LORD of hosts, so that it will leave them neither root nor branch. ²But for you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness shall rise with healing in its wings. You shall go out leaping like calves from the stall. ³And you shall tread down the wicked, for they will be ashes under the soles of your feet, on the day when I act, says the LORD of hosts. ⁴Remember the law of my servant Moses, the statutes and just decrees that I commanded him at Horeb for all Israel. ⁵Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the great and awesome day of the LORD comes. ⁶And he will turn the hearts of fathers to their children and the hearts of children to their fathers, lest I come and strike the land with a decree of utter destruction.”

2 Thessalonians 3:6-13 ⁶Now we command you, brothers, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you keep away from any brother who is walking in idleness and not in accord with the tradition that you received from us. ⁷For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us, because we were not idle when we were with you, ⁸nor did we eat anyone’s bread without paying for it, but with toil and labor we worked night and day, that we might not be a burden to any of you. ⁹It was not because we do not have that right, but to give you in ourselves an example to imitate. ¹⁰For even when we were with you, we would give you this command: If anyone is not willing to work, let him not eat. ¹¹For we hear that some among you walk in idleness, not busy at work, but busybodies. ¹²Now such persons we command and encourage in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living. ¹³As for you, brothers, do not grow weary in doing good.

Luke 21:5-28 ⁵While some were speaking of the temple, how it was adorned with noble stones and offerings, [Jesus] said, ⁶“As for these things that you see, the days will come when there will not be left here one stone upon another that will not be thrown down.” ⁷And they asked him, “Teacher, when will these things be, and what will be the sign when these things are about to take place?” ⁸And he said, “See that you are not led astray. For many will come in my name, saying, ‘I am he!’ and, ‘The time is at hand!’ Do not go after them. ⁹And when you hear of wars and tumults, do not be terrified, for these things must first take place, but the end will not be at once.” ¹⁰Then he said to them, “Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. ¹¹There will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and pestilences. And there will be terrors and great signs from heaven. ¹²But before all this they will lay their hands on you and persecute you, delivering you up to the synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors for my name’s sake. ¹³This will be your opportunity to bear witness. ¹⁴Settle it therefore in your minds not to meditate beforehand how to answer, ¹⁵for I will give you a mouth and wisdom, which none of your adversaries will be able to withstand or contradict. ¹⁶You will be delivered up even by parents and brothers and relatives and friends, and some of you they will put to death. ¹⁷You will be hated by all for my name’s sake. ¹⁸But not a hair of your head will perish. ¹⁹By your endurance you will gain your lives. ²⁰“But when you see Jerusalem surrounded by armies, then know that its desolation has come near. ²¹Then let those who are in Judea flee to the mountains, and let those who are inside the city depart, and let not those who are out in the country enter it, ²²for these are days of vengeance, to fulfill all that is written. ²³Alas for women who are pregnant and for those who are nursing infants in those days! For there will be great distress upon the earth and wrath against this people. ²⁴They will fall by the edge of the sword and be led captive among all nations, and Jerusalem will be trampled underfoot by the Gentiles, until the times of the Gentiles are fulfilled. ²⁵“And there will be signs in sun and moon and stars, and on the earth distress of nations in perplexity because of the roaring of the sea and the waves, ²⁶people fainting with fear and with foreboding of what is coming on the world. For the powers of the heavens will be shaken. ²⁷And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. ²⁸Now when these things begin to take place, straighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.”

Notes on Today’s Service

Treasures from the Church: “I am baptized! You can only do me in if you can take the name of the Lord from off me!” – Rev. Norman Nagel

Summary of the Readings: There are signs of the Lord’s coming all around: the cross that marks His Church, the violence and death of the sinful world, and the shaking of the natural order. “There will be great distress upon the earth” (Luke 21:23), but the faithful know that “the kingdom of God is near” (Luke 21:31). Therefore, “straighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near” (Luke 21:28). Be awake and alert, and heed the words of Christ, which “will not pass away” (Luke 21:33). For you, “the sun of righteousness shall rise with healing in its wings” (Mal. 4:2). He sends His preachers of repentance in the spirit and power of Elijah “before the great and awesome day of the Lord comes” (Mal. 4:5), in order to “direct your hearts to the love of God and to the steadfastness of Christ” (2 Thess. 3:5). Although you are often faithless, “the Lord is faithful,” and by the preaching of His Word “he will establish you and guard you against the evil one” (2 Thess. 3:3). Therefore, “do not grow weary in doing good” (2 Thess. 3:13). In the midst of calamity, believe upon the Lord, Jesus Christ.

The Divine Service: “In worship Christ is summoning us home to be with Him when He invites us to sit and listen to His Word with our ears or our eyes and then come forward and receive His flesh with our mouths. Our eyes are opened to His bodily presence where He offers us the best seat at the table and the finest food. We have come home to be with God in our Father’s house, a foretaste of our final homecoming at the Lamb’s banquet in His kingdom that has no end. Worship is our home, our *own unique culture*, inhabited by Christ Himself, where we know by heart it’s language and its rhythms for we have immersed ourselves in its life because it is His life...What is given us in our worship is a map of the world in which we live. With this map in hand we navigate this fallen world with an apocalyptic worldview, one in which we see Him revealed daily in humble acts of Christian charity and mercy and forgiveness. This is so because we are the baptized, invaded by Christ’s Spirit, released from the bondage of our sins by forgiveness, joined to Christ’s life and given His character. The world we live in is both the present evil age and the world made new by Christ’s real presence. But time is different for us now. We are already in the end times, living as if tomorrow Christ would come again in glory even as He comes daily to us by His grace. The Christ we commune with in the liturgy of Word and Sacrament sends us forth to preside over the liturgy of life as we follow the map of the world in which we now live, Christ’s world and ours, a world where heaven has come to earth to dwell among us, full of grace and truth.” - From Heaven on Earth: The Gifts of Christ in the Divine Service by Arthur A. Just Jr., p. 279.

Sermon: The Energizer Bunny television commercials boast that their batteries last infinitely longer than any other. The motto for their commercials is that they are “still going.” During these last days of the church year our focus is on the end, and that’s good because we need to deal with the truth that our life in this world and the world itself are both going to end. Yet, to date this fallen world is still going and the fact that you’re still here means that you’re still going, too. This morning I invite you to ponder the fact that the world’s attempts to rid itself of God and His church have failed. The killing of the Son of God and the hatred and persecution of those who believe in Him throughout history have not stopped the Lord and His church. We’re still going. Not even death could stop Jesus for He rose from the dead, with witnesses, just as He said He would do. Your death in Christ will not stop you, either, for Jesus, the risen Lord, has promised “whoever believes in Me, though he die, yet shall he live.” As the psalmist reminds us, “the Lord will preserve your coming in and going out from this time forth and forevermore.”

Colors

Fall is my favorite season with its crisp, cool air, warm scents, and most enjoyably, the beautiful colors of the changing leaves; however, fall did not last long this year in Wisconsin, so those colors faded quickly. Despite the already chilly weather, I still enjoy seeing the bright white color of the snow covering the ground. As I looked out of our classroom window today, thinking about that rapid change in colors as fall faded into winter, I realized that "color," is something that I am surrounded by daily in kindergarten. From hanging classroom decorations to water coloring sight words and enjoying art time, the kindergarten students and I spend a great deal of our day surrounded by color. In fact, at the end of a busy day of learning, the students (and the teacher!) often go home covered in paint, glue, glitter and marker—all signs of our learning and play. The colors cover our fingers and hands, our clothing, and occasionally leave traces on our faces, and despite washing our hands throughout the day, there are always some marks and colors that remain, never truly leaving us clean again. Today, as I sat scrubbing a highly stubborn mark away at the end of our day, I was reminded of one of my favorite verses from Isaiah: "Though your sins are like scarlet they shall be white as snow" (Isaiah 1:18).

Our sins are just like those paint and marker stains that cover our hands in kindergarten. Each time we sin by saying an unkind word, breaking a commandment, etc., we gain another stain, or blemish, that cannot be washed away with simple soap and water. Our hearts are permanently covered in the blackness of sin. Yet just as the snow outside blankets the ground, God's forgiveness, through the death and resurrection of His Son, Jesus, covers our stains of sin. The beautiful truth is that when God looks at us, he doesn't see our black stains of sin, but rather He sees the colorful array of our new life in Christ. He sees the blue of the waters of our baptism, the red of Christ's shed blood, the brown of the cross where He died, the green of new life we have through the Holy Spirit, and the golden crown we wear because we will one day be home with Him in His heavenly kingdom. So when I reflect on the beautiful colors of changing leaves and on the white snow that proves fall has faded into winter - I remember that the most beautiful color change that takes place is the change of our sin-stained heart into a new, clean creation through the forgiveness of Jesus Christ.

IT'S COLD OUTSIDE! Imagine being outside for 20 minutes with the temperature at 28° but it feels like 17°. Now, imagine yourself without a winter coat, hat, scarf, or gloves/mittens on. 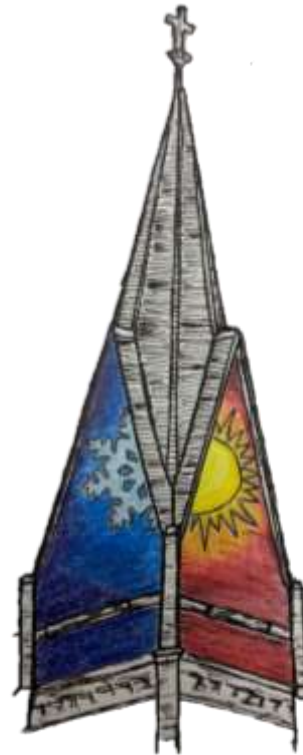
